Many hands and hearts help us carry out our mission. Hope would not have the reputation as a high-quality care provider without the help of nearly **150 volunteers** who fill the gaps by providing patient comfort and companionship, caregiver respite, and assistance at our office and at special events.

Additionally, our **Outreach Team** is in the field several times each week giving educational presentations to staff at senior-care facilities, hospitals, and other venues in need of training

on how to best care for elderly or chronically ill patients.

Similarly, our **Community Educators** offer workshops and trainings to members of the public who are currently engaging as caregivers to family members or other loved ones.

Our **Grief Support Team** provides bereavement care to our hospice families and to anyone in the community in need, regardless of whether their loved one was on our hospice service.




PHILANTHROPIC SUPPORT

4th Annual Hope 100 Golf Marathon

October 8, 2018 • \$73,950

Twenty passionate golfers took to the Valley Course at Castlewood Country Club in Pleasanton for this unique event. Participants committed to raising at least \$2,500 in support from family and friends while they play 100 holes of golf in one day.

Ninth Annual Hike for Hope

More than 600 hikers and walkers hit the trails to support Hope's mission to provide exceptional, compassionate patient care in our local communities. Many participants were hiking in memory of departed loved ones and carried photos or mementos with them on the hike. Participants also could write names of loved ones on paper shoes and hang them on the Shoe Memorial.

Where your DOLLARS go

Your contributions help us provide quality hospice care to an increasing number of families each year, create new services, offer a broader range of care, provide education, and help families through their grief. Here are just some ways your dollars have benefited your neighbors in need:



Grief Support

While the physical care our clinical staff provides to hospice patients is typically reimbursed through Medicare, other support is not. Your donations help operate Hope's Grief Support Center, where our hospice families and the community can come for complimentary support group care. The team also produces several single-day grief workshops, such as Handling the Holidays and one that explores grief through creative expression, and an annual Service of Remembrance. Our youth program allows families to explore their grief together, with support groups that cater to children and teens, and groups for parents/guardians of kids who have experienced the death of a loved one.



Family Caregiver Education

Many participants in our Family Caregiver Education Series are first-time caregivers and in desperate need of support. Our 12 complimentary classes offer instruction on basic

personal care, nutrition needs of the elderly, navigating the healthcare environment, and much more.

Dementia Care

At Hope, dementia-related conditions have surpassed cancer as the leading diagnosis upon admission. We are addressing the growing need by expanding our Living With Dementia program, which educates our staff, volunteers, hospice families, and the community about how to best care for and interact with persons living with dementia. Part of your donations fund complimentary dementia-specific classes for family caregivers who want to understand changes in their loved ones and how to provide care.

Advanced Illness Care

Patients who don't yet qualify for hospice benefits, or who have been discharged from hospice, are eligible for Advanced Illness Care. This free program keeps patients connected to Hope until they meet the Medicare requirements, and it provides a seamless transition to hospice when the time is right. Our social workers answer questions, provide emotional support, and identify community resources. Volunteers visit with the patients and provide caregiver relief.

Community Education

Hope's Outreach Team annually provides over 100 hours of education on senior-care related topics to local healthcare facilities and senior residential communities.




